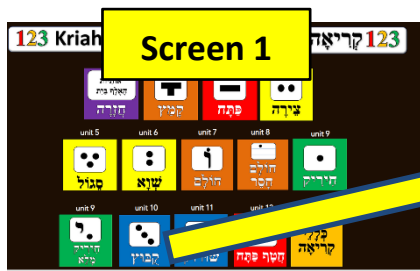


# Online Game: A Step-by-Step Guide

## How to open online games for my workbook page?

**To open a game:**  
Select from the main menu of the games (**screen 1**), the vowel you want to practice.



**Screen 2:** Shows the game options for the chosen vowel. (In this case, Kubutz has been selected.)  
Choose the game corresponding to the page number you wish to practice.



**Screen 3** presents an online game specifically designed to match the content covered on page 23 of the student's Chelek 3 workbook.

## How to play online game on the smart board in front of a classroom?

The teacher chooses a student to participate. The student is asked to select two cards from those displayed on the board, identifying them by their numbers in Hebrew. The teacher then taps on the chosen cards. If the speaker in the classroom is enabled, the text will be heard in Hebrew, and everyone should wait until the entire text is heard, as sometimes it includes a full sentence in Hebrew containing the word. If the speaker is disabled, the student is required to vocalize the Hebrew word shown. More advanced students may also be prompted to form a sentence using the word presented. The process repeats as the student selects another card to find a match. The class can be divided into two teams to compete against each other.

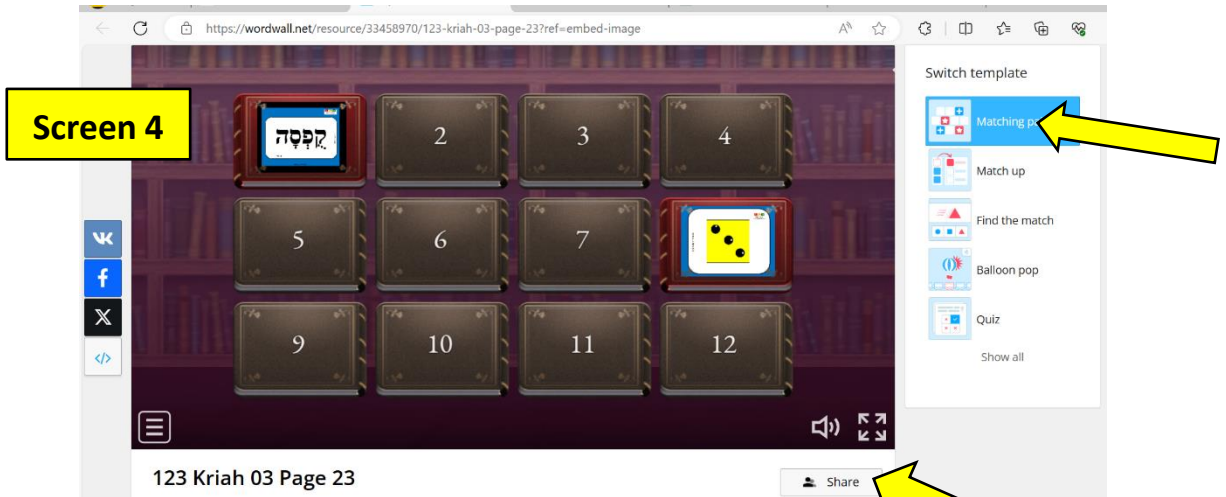
## Benefits of using online games at the student's home

Students can practice Hebrew by playing those games at home that incorporate Hebrew audio. Competing on a scoreboard motivates them to improve, while hearing the language during gameplay enhances their language learning experience.

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## How can the activity's template be switched?

Look for the **Switch template** panel on the right side of every activity page (Screen 3). The original template is listed at the top, with all the other options underneath.



## How can you share activities with your students?

1. Start by locating the **"Share"** button positioned at the bottom of the activity (**Screen 4**).
2. Click on the **"Share"** button to prompt a sharing window to appear.
3. Once the sharing window appears (**Screen 5**), you'll find a variety of options to share the game through different channels.
4. Choose the channel that best suits your needs, whether it's email, or educational platforms such as Google Classroom.
5. Proceed to share the game with your students or participants through the selected channel.
